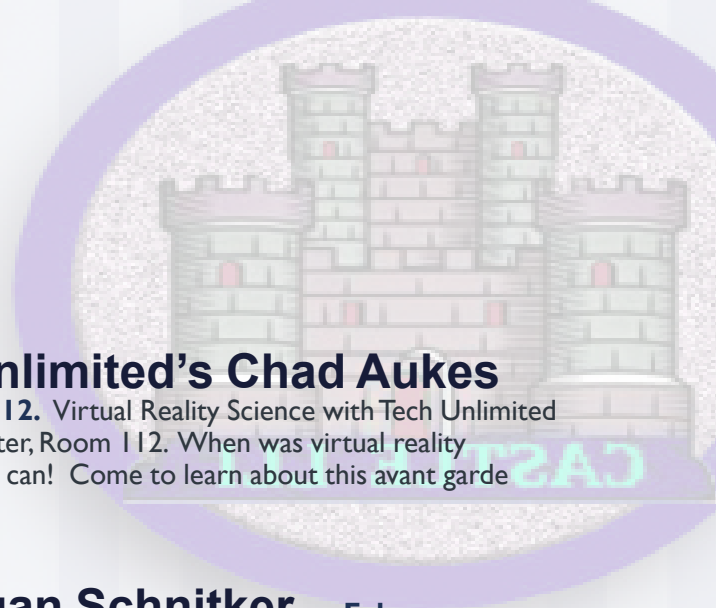
Here's Science in Your Eye! with Dr. Rebecca Huisken at the Community Center Room 112 on February 10 at 1:30 pm
